

**Templeton City Park & Shelter House
Rules & Regulations**

Reserving Shelter House: Reservation may be made by calling (712) 669-3443 or stop at City Hall between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, Monday through Friday.

Rental Fee: \$50.00 nonrefundable shelter house rental fee.

Deposit: \$100.00 deposit required. If no problems arise from the use and the shelter house and park grounds are found to be neat and cleaned by the renter and after proper inspection by city personnel your \$100.00 deposit check will be destroyed one (1) week after the reservation date. If a problem is encountered you will be contacted within one (1) week to discuss the matter.

Key: The key may be picked up at City Hall the day the facility is reserved or two days in advance if rented on a weekend. Return the key within 24 hours in the outside drop box located at City Hall.

Amenities: Refrigerator, furnace, 11 round tables, 4 rectangular tables & folding chairs.

Park Hours: Shelter house and park grounds closed from 12:00 midnight to 7:00 a.m. the next day. All persons reserving the shelter house and park grounds must have it cleaned prior to 12:00 midnight with picnic tables locked inside.

Trash: Dispose of trash in dumpster located on the east side of the city maintenance shop.

Vehicles: No parking on park property except for unloading and loading with a 15-minute limit within alley right-of-way.

Noise Level: To be kept at a reasonable level.

Penalties: Violation of these rules or damage to park property will result in loss of deposit. Any damages above deposit cost will be the liability of renting party.

The City of Templeton, City Council, Park Board, or affiliate(s) are not responsible for accidents, injury, or loss of individual property.
