

TEMPLETON CITY COUNCIL
NOVEMBER 14, 2016
5:30 P.M. – TEMPLETON CITY HALL

The Templeton City Council met on this fourteenth day of November 2016 at 5:30 o'clock p.m. at City Hall, Templeton, Iowa. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Behrens, and the roll was called showing the following named Council Members present and absent:

Approval of Agenda: A motion was made by Ramsey and seconded by Schoeppner to approve the agenda. All present voted in favor of the motion and the motion was carried.

Citizen's Forum: None

Sara Kappos from Veenstra & Kimm presented the following four options for the city's wastewater infrastructure project:

- Mechanical Plan Sequencing Batch Reactor
- Enhanced Aerated Lagoon Treatment – OPTAER/SAGR
- Enhanced Aerated Lagoon Treatment – LEMTEC/LEMNA
- Controlled Discharged Lagoon

A motion was made by Bauer approving Sara Kappos recommendation to submit a facility plan for a Controlled Discharged Lagoon, seconded by Ramsey. All present voted in favor of the motion and the motion was carried.

Chris Whitaker from Region XII Council of Governments addressed the council to discuss the following funding options available for the city's wastewater infrastructure project.

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
- United States Department of Agricultural (USDA)
- State Revolving Fund (SRF)
- Revenue Bonds
- Increase Sewer Rates

A motion was made by Bauer authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to submit and sign a State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan application, seconded by Schoeppner. All present voted in favor of the motion and the motion was carried.

Council Member Bauer introduced and moved for the adoption of resolution entitled "Resolution to Enter into a Contract with SGS, LLC DBA Carroll Refuse Service for Solid Waste & Recyclables Collection", seconded by Council Member Irlbeck. After due consideration, the Mayor put the question on the motion and the roll being called, the following named Council Members voted:

**RESOLUTION TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH

WHEREAS, Carroll Refuse Service, LLC sold their business to SGS, LLC DBA Carroll Refuse Service; and

WHEREAS, the Templeton City Council met with Lisa Lampe DBA Carroll Refuse Service, LLC and new owners Jeff Greteman, Josh Snyder, & Kenny Snyder SGS, LLC DBA Carroll Refuse Service on October 3, 2016 notifying the city of Templeton regarding their transfer of ownership; and

WHEREAS, the Templeton City Council approved the transfer on October 3, 2016 and desires to enter into a contract with SGS, LLC DBA Carroll Refuse Service for residential solid waste and recyclables collection; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that it is in the best interest of the City of Templeton to enter into a contract with SGS, LLC DBA Carroll Refuse Service. The Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with SGS, LLC DBA Carroll Refuse Service. Said contract is hereby approved on this 14th day of November, 2016 and the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute all appropriate documents to effectuate this Resolution.
